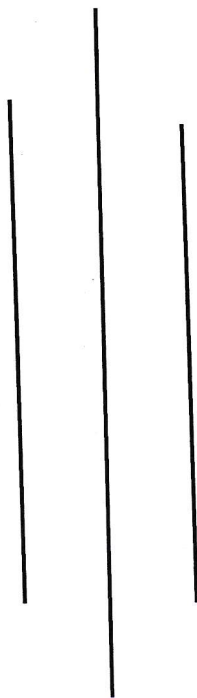

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1. Introduction

Founded in 2013 AD by a group of academicians and educators, Samriddhi College aims to provide high-quality education equal to the most renowned institutions worldwide. With an international board of advisors and guest lecturers, Samriddhi provides its students with an expanded curriculum, including project based learning, extensive lab and digital activities, specialized IT and business instruction, personality development, global studies, field work, internships, individual and group presentation and so on.

Samriddhi College – an IT and management college affiliated to Tribhuvan University (TU) – is probably the one of the first choices for the students interested in IT and management education in Nepal, mainly due to its commitment to provide quality education in various programs conducted for undergraduates. Samriddhi offers a wide range of IT and management courses for various programs such as Bachelor of Computer Science and Information Technology (BSc. CSIT), Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA), Bachelor of Business studies (BBS) and Bachelor in Art of Social Work (BASW). Over the period, Samriddhi has been able to produce highly competent human resources in the field of IT, management and social work. It has been able to serve the nation by providing quality education in IT and management as per the demand of 21st century. Samriddhi also focuses to provide well-equipped, well-maintained and attractive services, facilities, and learning resources for the students.

6. Academic, Contextual, and Environment Analysis

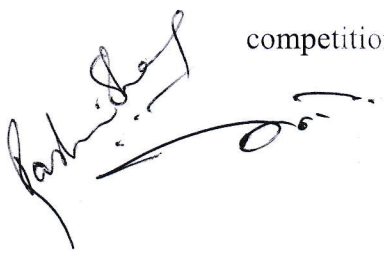
Advanced information technology has been playing an integral role in today's teaching-learning activities. Most of the international colleges and universities are providing multimedia and online resources for the purpose of post-study. Many international institutions also leverage mobile/web apps for communication between teachers-students-parents as well as disseminating important information like results, notices, assignments and calendar.

In comparison, Nepal is far behind than other countries in terms of leveraging technology for educational purposes. Nepal is lagging behind in upgrading its standard in teaching-learning methods as the government does not have a reforming attitude and a focus on higher education development.

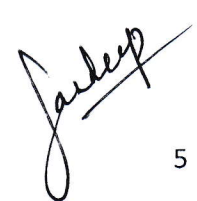
On a brighter side, general people are becoming more aware of the technologies and online medium, which will help institutions incorporate technology as an important institutional infrastructure.

The other important aspect in Nepal is the lack of practical and job-oriented education. Higher education sector has not been able to scale up and resonate with the market demand resulting in brain drain. However there is a possibility of collaboration with foreign universities that can help gain necessary exposure for the colleges and students alike.

The context of education is changing through the lucrative marketing of international universities, their credentials, and quality. The distance modes through online access to international degrees are the easiest measures for the students to go through a flexible university degree. This may pose a great challenge in the years to come in the form of competition.



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6.1. Institutional Management

Samriddhi College has a clear and profound vision and corresponding plans to achieve it. The AGM is the top dominant governance body of the institution. The promoter selects the BOD through the AGM who plays the key role in the decision-making process of the institution.

Board grants the authority to the college Principal to intervene in the decision for day-to-day operations. The Principal executes and implements the strategic decision through the systematic and planned approach having strong coordination and cooperation with different departments and administrative heads.

6.2. Economic and Financial Management

The college follows the financial rules and regulations as per the plan and policy of economic and financial management as formulated and decided by the financial directive of the institution.

6.3. Academic evaluation and Output

Samriddhi College formed the exam committee to conduct the internal examination and performance evaluation of the students. The committee conducts three internal examinations, which will support the students' preparation for final examinations conducted by Tribhuvan University.

7. Growth and Development Strategy of the Institution

7.1. Physical Infrastructure Development

Samriddhi College has spread over three ropanies of land (rented) that includes one main building, computer labs, multipurpose hall, 11 tutorials rooms and administrative offices. The college library has around 3,685 textbooks, 855 reference books, 2,260 others related books along with 58 journals, 500 prospectus, 85 brochures, 27 occasional papers, with 7500 e-resources, 1200 research reports and 200 government documents.

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In order to facilitate and make the teaching learning process more effective, Samriddhi uses technologies such as computers, high speed internet, LAN, projectors, etc. Currently the college has projectors in every classroom and 144 computers with 120 mbps internet speed.

The college management is dedicated to placing all the essential facilities to promote a learning environment. There is a well-maintained cafeteria inside the campus premises. Samriddhi provides a facility with safe drinking water and hygienic toilets for its staff, students, and visitors. After the Covid-19 pandemic, sanitizers have been placed on each floor of the college building. The college has playgrounds for outdoor games and recreational centers that support indoor games and activities.

The college includes the following infrastructure development plan

- Phase-wise acquisition of about 10-15 ropanies of Land
- Phase-wise implementation of infrastructure master plan
- Phase-wise recruitment of teaching and supporting staff
- Phase-wise construction plan for classroom, laboratory, library, administration, audio-visual centres, student dormitory and staff housing.
- Rent temporary buildings.
- Transfer plan of programs to the permanent location.

7.2. Special Programs

Samriddhi College believes that education should be engaging, progressive and incorporate social and soft skills in the teaching. In addition, the college emphasizes smooth communication between faculty members, parents, students and society.

It aspires to produce students with understanding of the contemporary challenges, and ability to face and solve them. With an international board of notorious professionals, academics, technology experts, the college provides both theoretical knowledge and practical skills

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required to function well in today's competitive marketplace. The enhanced curriculum includes:

- A serene ambience far from busy cities, roads with multiple sport programs for healthy living.
- Fruitful internship opportunities with distinguished companies.
- Interactive lectures and talk shows through teleconferencing with prominent academics and professionals.
- Workshops in public speaking, interviewing, resume writing skills and personality development and different awareness programs.
- Workshops and classes in information technology.

7.3. Extra-curricular Activities

In Samriddhi, students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities to hone their soft skills. They are given opportunities where they can enhance and grow themselves. With the purpose of overall development as a professional, students are encouraged to come up with their new creativities, innovative programs and valuable participation. These activities are designed to meet the varied interests of the students and these activities are as much part of Samriddhi College as the regular academic exercises.

For the enhancement of student's personality and team growth, Samriddhi College not only focuses on academic courses but also places the interest on different extracurricular activities. With the collaboration of the student councils, Samriddhi organises different sports activities (such as Basketball, Football, Badminton, and Table Tennis competitions), writing competitions, speech competitions, essay competition, talent show, talk show, hiking, different educational tours and excursions, camp and many more.

The college supports the student council in exploring further resources. Further the college has high priority in student welfare activities. Students are encouraged to participate in various traditional and cultural programs organised at the local, national, and international levels, and even in competitions. Likewise, the students are also motivated to be involved in social welfare

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activities such as environmental cleanliness, social advocacy, blood donation program, social awareness program (through different means i.e. drama, dance, articles) and different workshops.

7.4. Academic Programs and Curricular Management

The college has been running the programs of Tribhuvan University that are in high demand. It is presently imparting the following high market valued academic programs.

- Bachelor of Computer Science and Information Technology (BSC. CSIT)
- Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA)
- Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS)
- Bachelor of Arts of Social Work (BASW)

The College follows the curriculum as prescribed by the Faculty of Humanities, Information Technology (IT) and Faculties of Management of Tribhuvan University. There is a systematic mechanism to review the curriculum periodically. Samriddhi College represents its subject committee members in the review meetings organised by the university. The college draws the attention of the University for the Concerns of the subject committee members in the public and private colleges.

College emphasises on regular development of the teaching faculties and administrative staff members. To deliver quality education and adapt market-driven courses, the college sets the following major goal in the Master Plan:

- Quality and equal access education for all the students.
- Develop, grow, sustain, and evaluate new and ongoing strategic initiatives that Serve College and university missions and advance the college's vision.

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- Provide the best preparation, the greatest intellectual challenge, the most intellectually satisfying opportunities, and the highest quality experience, to an increasing number of students.
- Faculty development and employee motivation programs.
- Promote and integrate areas of research in regular academic programs.
- Work through gradual quality improvement aspects.

8. Human Resource Management

Samriddhi regards its staff as their biggest asset. The college periodically reviews and prepares future and long-term human resource plans. The plan is based on the total number of students enrolled and administrative workloads.

The college follows the rules as defined in the operating policies. The college has a decentralised management approach by forming a separate department to handle the academic, administrative, financial functions. The faculties and the staff are provided with growth opportunities like attending seminars, workshops and supports for overall academic and personal development.

9. Student Enrolments

Samriddhi College enrolled students in the faculty of Management, Arts & Humanities, and Information Technology. The enrolments process includes initial consultation, entrance exam, admission, and orientation. The enrolment is open to any students willing to build a career in the public or private sectors or be an entrepreneur.

The College accommodates the enrolment demand by increasing the sections in BBS, BSC CSIT, BASW and BCA programs. By 2025, College plans to increase the diversity of its student body by enlisting or imposing a quota for a minimum of 1% international students.

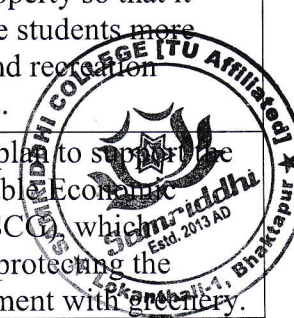
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10. Assessment of the Existing Facilities and Plan

11. Master Plan Implementation Strategy

11.1. Maximum Resource Utilisation

Samriddhi College fully utilises its physical infrastructures, human resources, space availability and leverages further to explore new areas for research and innovation. It ensures proper classroom conditions, laboratories, access to potable water, proper reading halls, and common rooms for students and seminar halls to increase an academically sound and effectiveness of teaching-learning environment. The college maximises utilisation rates; drives down physically large equipment and rationing the scarce resources promote institutions to maintain the affordable fees and improve the quality of learning.

11.2. Assessment of the Existing and Further Services Plan

The available physical infrastructure is optimally utilised beyond regular college hours, leasing to exams for public service commission, allowing third parties to use the infrastructure to conduct co-curricular activities/extra-curricular activities, training, meetings, and seminars.

Monitoring of the finance is usually done through software-based reporting; the principal has access to look after the implementation plans and their success. The Executive Board monitors and reviews them in their meetings and especially during the AGM for the finalization and for effective implementation of the Master Plan.



12. The Study Method and Resources mobilisation

The college has been growing its infrastructure, whereas the financial transparency and competent human resources in the operation are its core strength. The college has been remarkably improving the teaching-learning quality and operational effectiveness. - (e) Head- Finance and accounting: - Accountants

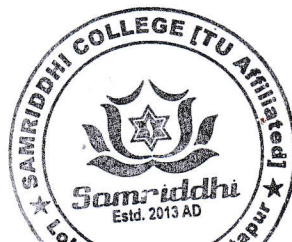
However, stakeholders have been raising some concerns about the QAA and financial crisis but they are also providing support by giving ideas that might help with the fiscal processing of the campus.

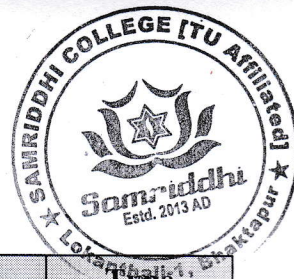
